

MUSIC POLICY FOR NORTH LAKE L.L.

- Music may be played between innings, but not during a pitching change, injury timeout, or umpire conference.
- Walk up music may be played as players walk up for their at bat and must be turned off once the batter has one foot in the batter's box.
- Music (speaker) must be aimed towards your own team's dugout.
- Please use discretion when selecting music and volume with which music is played. (i.e. no foul language, sexual content, slurs or vulgarity.)
- No music is allowed at any game or practice taking place at Moorland's Park.
- It is at the discretion of the umpire or any board member on duty if the volume is too loud or the music's content is inappropriate. NLLL will take reasonable steps to keep a safe family environment including removing music that is inappropriate.
- Home team = Home team rules. If an NLLL team is playing an away game with a neighboring league that prohibits music, the NLLL team must comply with their rules.
- If either NLLL manager does not wish to have music played between innings or as walk-up music, both teams will follow the same protocols. It's recommended the Coaches address this topic before the game, upon arrival or at the plate meeting.
- Music is not allowed to be played after the last out of any game.
- Suggestion – seek one of the many apps for this purpose: BallparkDJ Walkout Intros, Walkout Song DJ, Walkout Song Creator DJ, Next Batter Up, etc.
- This rule is back on a probationary basis, and it will be a “one strike and you're out” policy for each time.
